A few of the major initiatives already confirmed for 2012 are:

Mr Waters will be staying on in a temporary capacity and Mrs Cooper will continue her essential work in the library.

A number of other positions will also be recruited through merit selection early in 2012, including a position of Community Liaison Officer (CLO).
