WHAT'S HAPPENING IN 1/2M

We are now halfway through Term 4 and things are really starting to get busy. We have lots of interesting activities to look forward to over the next four and a half weeks including Swimming School, our school musical performance and gala evening as well as the general day-to-day school events. As we start to prepare for these activities we will still be working hard in the classroom with our academic activities too.

This week we will be starting a literacy unit on the picture book, 'Big Rain Coming' which is set in a remote Indigenous community south-east of Katherine in the Northern Territory. The story includes a cast of characters – kids, dogs and frogs – who spend a week anxiously waiting for rain. We will be using the book to help with spelling and writing as well as reading activities.

In maths we will be working on chance, volume and capacity, and length and will be using hands-on activities to help develop students' understandings. We will also be using the tablets (mini computers) to reinforce some of the skills and strategies taught during each week.

Our PE program will continue to include activities that develop skills for ball games, gymnastics and balance. On Fridays we will continue to try a sporting game that puts these skills together. If you are free on Fridays, drop by and join us for a game.

We look forward to catching up during the remainder of the term and hope to see you all at our end-of-year celebrations.
