

GETTING ALONG - Focus of the Week

Taking someone else's perspective.

Perspective-taking refers to a person's ability to consider a situation from a different point of view. It requires you to put yourself in the other person's position and imagine what you would feel, think, or do if you were in that situation.

When you are able to imagine a situation from someone else's perspective, you can gain a better understanding of someone else's motives or change your own behaviour so you don't offend someone.

Children are more likely to listen to others and be more considerate if parents used this kind of "other-oriented" discipline, pointing out the direct consequences of the child's behaviour on someone else or pointing out feelings.
