The following information to the most common questions comes from the DoE website that is accessible to all parents. <i>Why did our school close for 1 day?</i> The response protocols for confirmed cases of COVID-19, where the person has been on school grounds or involved in any school activities within the previous 3 weeks, requires reporting to the internal department's internal incident reporting hotline. Advice is then given that the school must follow. NSW Health determine the appropriate course of action required to minimise the risk to the wider community. In this case the school was closed for one day as a precautionary measure to identify any risk and for cleaning. Making the school non-operational while the contact tracing process is completed minimises risk. <i>What is the deep clean?</i> When school cease operation they undergo thorough cleaning of the school site to ensure the environment is clean and safe prior to the school resuming onsite learning. This is standard practise for the safety of our students. We also have twice daily cleaning of all high touch surfaces. <i>Why do we not know more and who decides?</i> The communications provided are given to the school from NSW Health and we follow the advice we are given. This includes the messages we put of Facebook/Seesaw/ text and the letters we send to parents. It is the direct action of NSW Health and we follow the advice we are given.

I can not thank them enough for getting this work done very late in the evening so our students could get back to school.		

#### **Schools Plus Smart Giving Grant**

On Friday I received some great news that we have been awarded a \$30,000 grant to improve our school grounds. The grant was for our sustainable gardens, outdoor kitchen and recycling program that included a proposal to have a chook pen to recycle food scraps and provide eggs for breakfast club and cooking.

We look forward to planning more with the Schools Plus program to further expand the exceptional opportunities we already provide for our students.

We will keep you updated of the great developments from this grant in 2022.

#### Uniform

Every day the vast majority of students are making the effort to come dressed in full uniform. The students look very proud when they all are dressed in their uniform as it increases a sense of belonging and builds school pride. Having a uniform makes everyone equal in terms of dress, shows we are one team learning together, and wearing the uniform reinforces that it is important to follow the expected standards at school.

Children who do not have correct uniform can be excluded from school events such as excursions when wearing uniform is important for easy recognition and safety. Children may also be excluded from representing school or attending visiting performances if they are not dressed in correct uniform.

Broad brimmed school hats are compulsory for all students and must be worn at all times in the playground. The school has a "No hat, No play" policy for safety of students all year round.
